Holy Cross High School is excited to announce Rob Wermeling as the successor for the recently retired and longtime head baseball coach Pat Ryan.

Wermeling - a native of Villa Hills Ky and current Holy Cross Faculty Member - has been coaching within the Indians baseball program since 2012. He began his career as a JV Assistant in 2012 and has been the Head JV Coach since 2013. During his tenure manning the JV helm under Pat Ryan, Wermeling has enjoyed a great deal of success, including reaching the semi-finals in the Northern Kentucky 9th Region JV Tournament in 2014. This past season, Wermeling led the Indians JV squad to an impressive 16-8 record.

Aside from his JV coaching duties, Wermeling also has assisted in administering annual Holy Cross Baseball Camps; he has helped out on the varsity level upon completion of each JV season, and was an Assistant Coach for the Northern Kentucky Junior/Senior All Star Game.

Wermeling is also the current Head Boys Golf Coach at Holy Cross. He began his golf coaching career with the Indians in 2011 as an assistant. In 2012, he was promoted to Head Coach. Here, too, Wermeling has enjoyed a great deal of success. He has taken several individual to the Kentucky All A State Tournament and the KHSAA Kentucky State Golf Tournaments.

Since being hired into the Religion Department by retired Principal Clay Eifert in 2011, Wermeling has taught Religion 1, 2, 3, and 4. He is the school's current Right to Life Coordinator, which includes supervising a yearly trip to Washington DC for the national Right to Life March. Also, he assists in coordinating Junior/Senior Days of Recollection and Senior Retreats. He has been a longtime supporter and participant in the Diocese's Christian Awakening Program dating back to 1994.

Prior to coming to Holy Cross, Wermeling coached at Cooper High School (JV Head Coach 2011), McNicholas High School (JV Assistant 1997 and JV Head Coach 1998-99). During his tenure at McNicholas, he was also a Varsity Assistant for teams that reached the State Semifinals in 1997 and won the Ohio State Championship in 1998.

Wermeling is a 2010 alum of Thomas More College where he graduated with a BES in Theology. While at Thomas More, he was a member of the school's baseball team in 1995 and 1996. He graduated from Covington Catholic High School in 1993. He currently resides in Florence Ky with his wife Ann, stepson Nick, and daughter Elizabeth.
