



FIVE STUDENTS ACCEPTED INTO **GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS PROGRAM**



The Governor's Scholars Program (GSP) is a five week summer residential program for outstanding high school juniors. Students must complete an application and be nominated for the program by their district. Over 1,000 Kentucky students are selected yearly based on a thorough application process detailing their academic achievement, extracurricular involvement, volunteerism and personal integrity.

THREE HC ARTISTS TO ATTEND GOVERNOR'S SCHOLARS FOR THE ARTS PROGRAM



The Kentucky's Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) is the sister program to the Governor's Scholar Program. GSA auditions promising high school sophomores and juniors in nine different art disciplines: architecture & design, creative writing, dance, drama, instrumental music, musical theatre, new media, visual art and vocal music. Over 1700 students apply to the Governor's School for the Arts summer program. From this number only 256 get to attend this amazing summer arts program. Graduates from the programs are eligible for a host of scholarships and educational opportunities in all fields of study.

Katie Holtz Selected to Participate in Commonwealth Honors Academy

The Commonwealth Honors Academy (CHA) is an exciting, challenging three week academic, social and personal growth program for outstanding high school students who have completed their junior year. Students are selected from the Commonwealth and surrounding region after an intense and selective application process. Junior Katie Holtz, was selected to attend CHA and will get to experience three weeks of educational and co-curricular activities on the Murray State University campus.

She will receive six hours of university credit and if she decides to go to Murray State in the future Katie will receive a \$2,000 per year housing scholarship.

Zeke Pike's talk to our students at Holy Cross District High School was one of the most passionate, authentic and interesting presentations that I have witnessed in my 32



Holy Cross won its bracket of the Doc Morris Classic with victories over Grant County and Cooper. They had good wins over Scott, St. Henry and often played well against some of the region's best teams.

A number of players had their personal "first" in varsity competition. Parker Zimmerman, Ben Borman, Owen Finke and Jordan Niehaus won their "first" pitching victories. Jason Russell, Ben Borman, Kevin Cusick and Loel Haggard, each had their 'first" varsity base hits. Ethan Baker, Ben Borman, Loel Haggard, Hunter Twehues, Elijah Hisle, Jason Russell and Harrison Tuke made their "first" appearances in varsity competition.

Jake Webster, Joey Yancey and Brian Carl made the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference All-Star Team.

Jake Webster and Joey Yancey hit their way into the Holy Cross Baseball Single Season record book. Webster is now among the leaders in batting average, hits, doubles, triples, stolen bases, RBI's, and runs scored. Yancey's outstanding offensive season landed him among the elite in batting average, hits, stolen bases and runs scored.

The junior varsity team had a great season finishing with a record of 16-8. They had signature victories against Campbell County, Scott, Dixie, Boone County, Newport Central Catholic, Brossart and St. Henry. They defeated Scott in the first round of the JV Regional before bowing out against Covington Catholic in the quarterfinals.

The freshman team, led by first year coach and Holy Cross baseball alumnus, Gordon Lovensheimer '16, also had a very fine season. The young freshman squad of eight freshman and eight 7th and 8th graders, won 5 games playing a schedule laden with big schools. The most important aspect

ery pushed his current hitting streak to 15 straight games. That was not the only highlight of the day for Callery. He also hit his 1st collegiate home run.

As the Bobcats headed into the final weekend of Mid American Conference play, Callery was second on the team in batting average at .320, third in base hits and in 169 total at bats, had struck out only 12 times. At the hot corner, he had committed only 4 errors.

His baseball career at Holy Cross was even more amazing. Connor Callery struck out a total of only 6 times in his high school career encompassing over 500 at bats. He also holds the KHSAA record of 38 consecutive games with at least one hit. During his senior season at Holy Cross, Callery hit .455, collected 45 hits and 27RBI. He was named All State in Kentucky 2013.



ALUM SEIBERT GROWING WITH THE CCU PROGRAM



Both the Cincinnati Christian University baseball Eagles and former Holy Cross High School baseball standout, Jared Seibert '15 took major strides in the second year of the program's existence.

The 2016 season was the freshman season for Seibert and the first in university history for CCU. The team struggled through a 2-42 season record and a 1-23 Kentucky Independent Athletic Conference record. Seibert's performance was typical of a freshman.

"Jared was asked to do a lot that first year," commented Head Baseball Coach John Taylor. "He played shortstop, 2B, 3B, the outfield, he caught and pitched. He never complained. This is a lot to ask a freshman to do. Jared always gave his best effort and I knew I could count on him."

The one year of experience and the hard knocks of 2016 season for Seibert and the Eagles began to turn around in 2017. The Eagles moved into a new athletic conference, the River States Conference and finished 9th of 10 teams. Their 7-25 conference was only 2 games behind 6th place Brescia. The Eagles finished the season with a much improved 13-38 overall record.

Jared Seibert's second season went even better. He settled into 2 primary roles. He was the team's everyday second baseman and a late inning reliever. As the starting second baseman, Seibert batted .348; had a .406 on base percentage; knocked 40 hits, including 5 doubles and 10 RBI's. For his performance he was nominated for post season conference honors.

"We expect Jared to continue to improve and be a leader for the next two years. He is the type of player we want in our program," stated Coach Taylor.

Remember When

he recent passing of Father Wilfred Fraenzle evoked memories of a man who was totally dedicated to helping the poor throughout his ministry. Fr. Fraenzle grew up in St. Ben's Parish, graduated from Covington Catholic in 1954 and entered the seminary soon after graduation. He was ordained on June 7, 1964. Prior to his ordination he was in charge of "Project Lancaster" in the mountains of Kentucky for two years. At one point, he spent five weeks street preaching there, possibly sparking his devotion to helping the people of Appalachia.

His first assignment after ordination was as assistant pastor of Holy Cross Church. He also served as spiritual director of the Junior League of Mary, YCS and CFM. During his four years at Holy Cross, he also taught freshman and sophomore religion.

However, his biggest and most lasting impression had to be starting the Mountain Mission Program here. In the summer of 1964, he arranged for ten junior and senior

"to be" girls to go to Paintsville and Lancaster to help the priests and nuns do manual labor.

The five girls who went to Paintsville cleaned, painted and readied for the re-opening of Our Lady of the Mountains School, a forty room former mansion operated by the Sisters of Divine Providence.

The Lancaster girls also cleaned and prepared for the upcoming school year. They also learned to like raisins, because, according to Kathy Lemmons Hoffman '65, they were in every dessert served while they were there.

Every year that he was here, Fr. Fraenzle took groups of students to work in the mountains. Even after he was re-assigned at the end of the 1968 school year, the Mountain Missions Program continued at Holy Cross.

I don't know when it ended or if Fr. Fraenzle was always the organizer, but the yearbooks always included photos of the volunteers among the activities listed at the school. The last group of workers was pictured in the 1977 yearbook. The photo below is from the 1974 yearbook.

The Israeli Seven Day War happened about the time the class graduated.

The Beatles visited Cincinnati, and in 1967 released its Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band album. Mini skirts were a fashion hit. Reflecting the Civil Rights Era, hit movies in 1967 included To Sir, with Love, In the Heat of the Night, and Guess Who's Coming to Dinner. But there were no cell phones, personal computers, email, ebooks or Facebook.

HOLY CROSS ALUMNUS PUBLISHES NOVEL SET IN CINCINNATI AND NORTHERN KENTUCKY



Holy Cross alumnus Gary Reed '67 is the author of A Fatal Cell Phone Video, a legal thriller set in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. With a "ripped from the headlines" feel, the novel revolves around the discovery of the murder of a young woman from a prominent Cincinnati family. Her cell phone contains video, made shortly before her death, of her husband, a trauma surgeon, and a

young Filipino nurse going into a sleazy motel.

Kathy Lutz '67 told her former classmates, "I would recommend it – it's one of those books that I said, 'I'll just read one more chapter before going to sleep,' and wound up reading several."

In the novel, the prosecutor is running for Congress on an anti-immigration and anti-Muslim platform. On learning that the physician-husband is a Muslim from the Middle East, he makes the prosecution of the husband a centerpiece of his campaign. The dead woman's best friend, however, has a

different theory. Can young attorney Devin Garner win an acquittal in his capital murder trial?

Gary Reed became interested in writing when he wrote for and edited the Herald, the HCHS student newspaper, and contributed to a HCHS literary journal in his senior year. Reed subsequently wrote for and edited the student newspaper at Xavier University.

Reed practiced law, first in private practice, and later with ChoiceCare Health Plans and Humana Inc. At Humana, Reed built and led the practice group that handled Humana's

litigation and independent investigations around the country.

Reed's first novel, The Blockbuster Drug, drew on his experience as a health care lawyer. Both novels are available from Amazon, Barnes & Noble, and other booksellers. Reed is currently working on an historical novel that takes place in the summer of 1939 Covington, Ky.
