# 2018-19 Annual Appeal Gets Off to a Flying Start at Benefactors Dinner



**T**hursday, October 25, 2018 was the kick off of our 2018-2019 Annual Appeal with the Blessing of Benefactors Dinner at Twin Oaks Plantation and Golf Club. The dinner is a way to acknowledge and thank individuals who contribute \$1,000 or more annually. It is also an opportunity for people to donate or pledge prior to receiving the Annual Appeal information.

This year, the fundraising efforts continue to focus on “Giving the Gift of Education” to a student, to update technology and to make necessary improvements throughout the school. The Annual Appeal also enables us to address many of the other school needs including expanding the campus and improving our facilities. The cost to educate a student continues to rise to a cost of approximately \$8,700 while our tuition rate is nearly \$1,800 less. In addition to this difference, the school has a sizable tuition assistance program to help families afford to give their children a Catholic education. The total financial need for all of our families constitutes about 23% of our school’s budget. In addition to the Annual Appeal, the Blessing of Benefactors event is another platform to ask Holy Cross alumni and friends to help fill the gap and give the “Gift of Education” to a student.

This year’s event was a huge success and again exceeded our expectations. Approximately 130 people attended and were treated to an excellent dinner, open bar and gifts, as well as being entertained by the Holy Cross choral group “HC Harmony” led by Mr. Tony Wagner and **Dan Trame** ’81 with some very serious and some extremely animated stories of what Holy Cross has meant to him as a student, a parent, a teacher and a coach. Dan is such an entertaining speaker that he had the entire audience wanting to hear more. In total, over \$165,000 was raised that night, which will go a long way in helping us accomplish our goal of keeping tuition increases at a minimum and to make the necessary improvements around the school. We would like to thank those who attended for their generosity. We are now hoping that the rest of our alumni and friends will continue this momentum and contribute through the Annual Appeal to whatever degree they are able. Every contribution of any size is important.

The response from those in attendance was so positive that we intend to continue this event again next year. We hope that next year more people will be able to join us at this unique and entertaining event.

# Students Earn Dual Credits at HC & NKU



Rob Kues former Holy Cross teacher who is now at NKU teaches a dual credit biology class in which the students receive credit for both high school and college. The students attend lectures on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 7:15 to 8:30 and then have a lab session on Friday mornings from 7:00 to 9:00. This is the same course that is taught to biology majors at NKU. Upon completion of the course, students will receive eight hours of credit. The Holy Cross students who attend this class are **Madelyn Ash, Luke Dreas, Allison Ehlman, Emma Lehmkuhl, Dominic Lemma, Evah-Marie Lemma, Grace Martin, Sean McIntosh, Alyssa Monson, Jackson Neff** and **Jessica Scheper**. In addition to the Holy Cross students, there are four students from NCC and two from Brossart in the class.

**Emma Lehmkuhl** had this to say about her experience: “Northern Kentucky University biology has given me and many others at Holy Cross a great opportunity to earn college credits while still being in high school. In this class, we benefit from NKU’s great facilities and lab tools. There



are two lecture days on Mondays and Wednesdays, and one lab on Fridays. In lecture, we take notes from many different medias such as videos, animations, and PowerPoint slides. We perform engaging experiments such as matching genes and mating different generations of fruit flies. In a recent lab, we had the opportunity to create our own experiment and hypothesis by using samples of plants and testing the rate of photosynthesis, light absorption, and cellular respiration. Instead of just memorizing biological terms and then being tested on them, we are constantly learning how to apply them to real life scenarios in plants and animals. Not only are we in a college class as high school students from Holy Cross, but we have been given the chance to take the class with other high school and college students. This dual credit college class has better prepared us for what college will be like, and for that we are all extremely thankful.”

## Art Department Get's a Makeover

Last year's Annual Appeal Special Challenge benefited the arts, which includes music, drama and visual arts. Art teacher Craig Lipscomb was so appreciative and overwhelmed by the generosity of our benefactors who donated to this challenge, especially many of his former students, that he wanted to share what he was able to accomplish with the funds.

According to Mr. Lipscomb the desks in the art department had been there since “the beginning of time” and although many beautiful pieces of art were created on them, it was time for an update. Over the summer Craig and Danny McDaniel from Iron Demensions Custom Creations in Covington made new desks using metal bases with wood tops. The desk assembly allows the tops to be replaced insuring that the new desks will be around as long or longer that the old ones.

## Senior Class Helps Emergency Shelter



This is a quiet little service project that the senior classes have been a part of since the year before the Emergency Shelter of Northern Kentucky came to be. Sr. Kathy Bauer came into the senior religion class and asked us to pray for its approval. So the seniors dedicated themselves to praying that this ministry could happen, despite all of the red tape and road blocks along the way.

After it opened they began feeding its clients. The senior class students donate money and others go out and buy the food. The students put notes of encouragement in each bagged meal. They make the brown bagged meals twice a month at school and hand-deliver them to the shelter. Currently they can only bring these meals once a month. The news of the needs of the Emergency Shelter continues to spread, so others have joined in the effort. The heartfelt donations of time, talent, and treasure are amazing as the students put feet to their faith with much joy and compassion.

It is always a joyful and humbling experience to watch them prepare but also to witness them mingling and sharing conversations with the clients at the shelter. There are many blessings swapped. Every year I tell the story to the new senior class and ask if they would like to continue in the legacy of the former graduates and I am greeted with an overwhelmingly positive response. ## SWAT TEAM LEADER VISITS GOVERNMENT CLASS



**Josh Bornhorn**, a 12 year veteran of the Covington SWAT Unit and a Holy Cross alumnus class of 1998, paid a visit to Pat Ryan's American Government class on November 15.

The class was working on a unit consisting of the many different aspects of local government. After studying basic types of city governments, the class took what they learned and compared it to that of Covington's city government.

Officer Bornhorn pointed out to the class that every city government in America is facing increasing challenges including housing shortages, homelessness, drug abuse and hunger. Together these issues lead to serious problems which put the police and other law enforcement agencies on the front lines. Officer Bornhorn told the class the continuum each officer goes through in approaching a possible suspect. He talked about the heroin epidemic in Northern Kentucky and the physical and mental destruction it has on a human body.

Officer Bornhorn answered a number of questions from the students ranging from his vast experiences as a law enforcement officer, to the many duties of the Covington SWAT team, to the witnessing a crime and reporting to the police. These were just a few of the areas covered. After the class ended, Officer Bornhorn commented to Mr. Ryan how impressed he was with the nature and the depth of the students' questions. Mr. Ryan said, "It was a great class".

## Honor AP Students Attend NKY Health Career Showcase

The boys' varsity soccer team ended their regular season with an 8-9-1 record. Injuries were suffered in the preseason and continued into the regular season. The team lost its leading scorer from the 2017 season just 10 minutes into the second game. However, the boys were a resilient group. Playing banged up and short-handed, the Indians had a number of bright spots including a 3-game winning streak against quality opponents (St. Henry, Madison Central, and Calvary Christian). Offensively the Indians were led by **Drew Wahl** (19 goals, 12 assists) and **Holden Lipscomb** (6 goals, 10 assists). The Indians also had 3 other player with 5-6 goals each.

Defensively, **Luke Dreas** was the glue holding the very young unit together. The post season started with the Indians avenging a regular season loss to Holmes. Winning 3-0, the Indians moved onto the finals where they lost in a very hard fought match to the Covington Catholic Colonels 0-2. Placing runner-up in the 35th district tournament, the Indians ad-

vanced to the regional tournament and lost in penalty kicks (4-5) to the Cooper Jaguars in a very hard fought game. The varsity Indians were led by 6 seniors this season: **Matthew Bunton, Loel Haggard, Jerome Heist, Chase Holmes, Grant Kraft, Austin Ross, Casey Vicars, and Drew Wahl.**

The freshmen team also had a very successful season going 9-3-1. After tying with Highlands in the first game, the freshmen Indians would lose only to powerhouse Ryle the rest of the season. In the freshmen regional tournament, the Indians lost to the Ryle Raiders for a second season in a row, 1-0. Once again, the freshmen team has a very bright future.

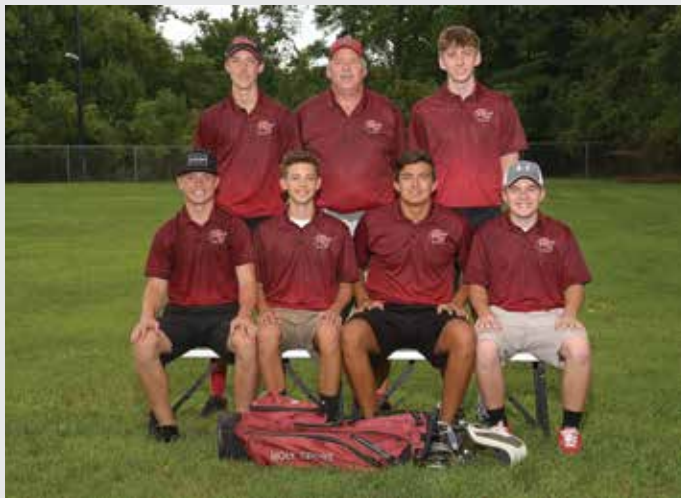
# Cross Country Boys and Girls Teams Led by Their Senior Players

# Remember When

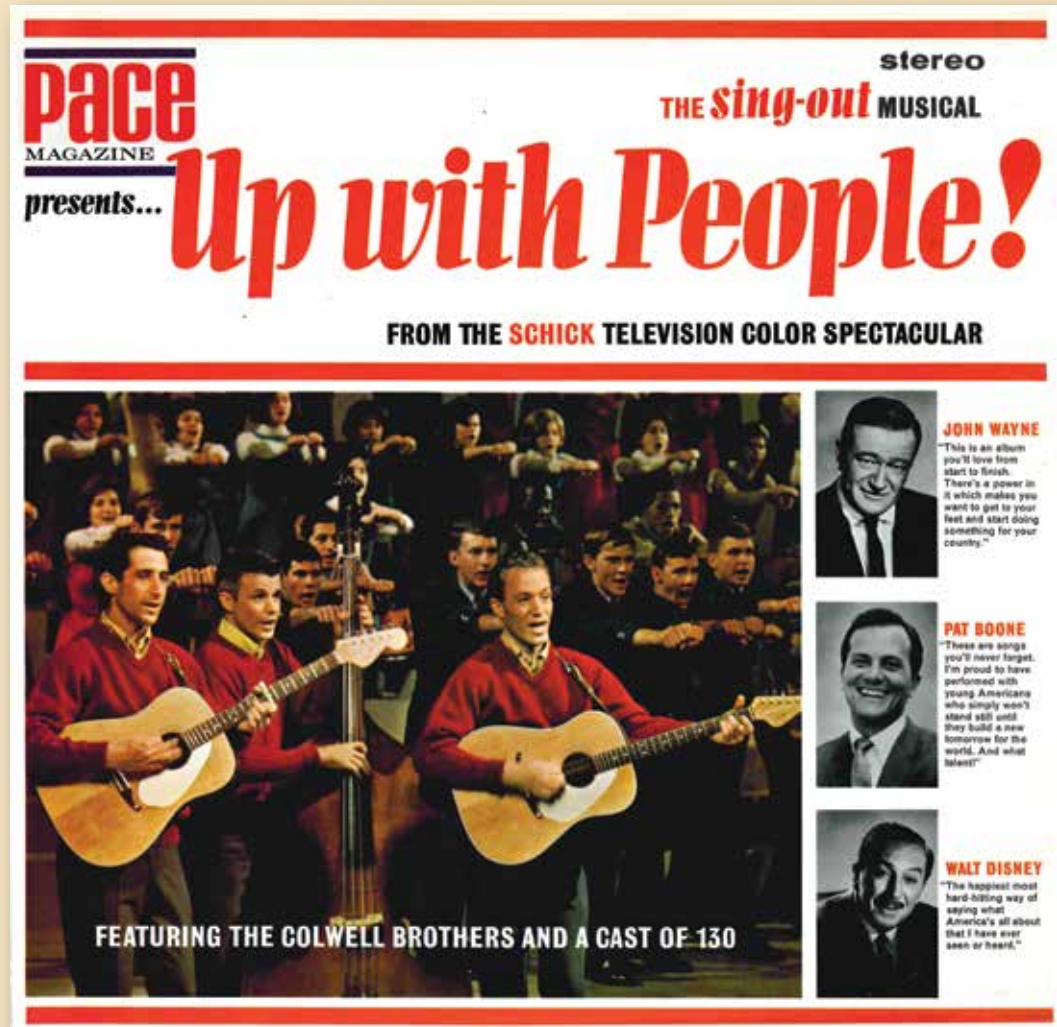
One of my frequent haunts is the monthly bazaar at Covington's Main Strasse Village every 4th Sunday from April to October. You never know what you might find there.

Recently, I was moseying through when I spotted this album laying forlorn among dozens of others. Somebody obviously picked it up and discarded it, probably not knowing what it was.

As soon as I saw it, I was mesmerized and started humming (to myself, of course) the songs that were on it that I hadn't thought about in years.

In early 1967, the grade and high school held a sing out that contained these songs. As far as the grade school went, everybody had to be in it (some of us reluctantly). The gym filled up quickly with guests and quite a few were turned away. Many who couldn't get in were parents of the performers but their disappointment was short lived as we did an encore the next week to appease everybody. I'm pretty sure we did it also during that week for the rest of the grade and high school.

## Jamie Lameier New Director of Advancement

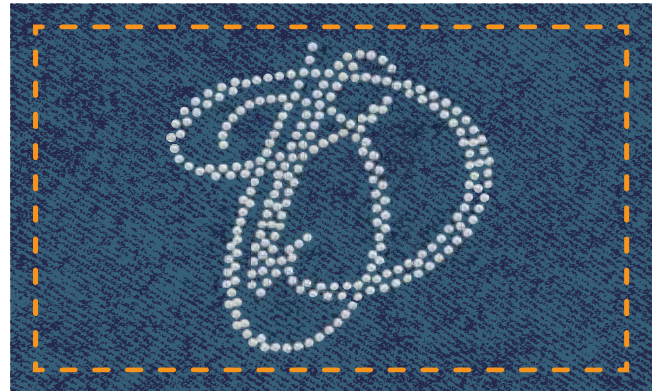

## LIFE INSURANCE AS PLANNED GIVING

Life insurance is an asset you may not think of donating to Holy Cross District High School until you hear how powerful, practical and simple it can be. When you own a life insurance policy with accumulated cash value, you're essentially sitting on a pile of money. When the original purpose for the protection no longer applies – such as to educate children now grown or to provide financial security for a spouse now deceased – your life insurance can be redirected to help support a worthwhile cause.

One option is simply to name Holy Cross District High School as the primary beneficiary. (Naming HCHS as beneficiary while you retain ownership of the policy does not qualify you for an income tax deduction.) Or, you can name HCHS as the beneficiary and also assign HCHS ownership of the policy as a current charitable gift. Doing so provides you tax benefits as outlined below.

When you assign HCHS ownership of a life insurance policy and also name HCHS as the beneficiary, the following good things happen:

- You receive an income tax charitable deduction, available under most circumstances.
- You realize tax savings from use of the deduction, and these savings can be invested for future income.
- You reduce your future estate tax liability.

### DONATING A NEW POLICY

Perhaps you don't own an existing policy but still realize how beneficial giving life insurance can be. If so, you can – in most states – purchase a new insurance policy and name a qualified charity like ours as the beneficiary and owner of the policy.
