## Freshman Course Overview

#### Mathematics

All freshmen students must take either PreAlgebra, Algebra I, Honors Algebra I, or Accelerated Geometry. Students will only be scheduled for Accelerated Geometry if they show a high level of proficiency by testing out of Algebra I. This test will be administered on Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 - 10:30 a.m. See one of the school advisors for more details. These courses are all full-year courses.

### English

All freshmen students must take English I. Students whose past grades and/or test scores show a
high level of achievement and proficiency may take Honors English I. English I and Honors
English I are full-year courses.

## Science

 All freshmen students must take Biology. Students whose past grades show a high level of achievement may be scheduled for Honors Biology. Biology and Honors Biology are full-year courses.

# Religion I

• All freshmen students must take Religion I. Four credits of Religion are required in order to graduate. Religion I is a full-year course.

## Health/Physical Education

• The State of Kentucky requires that every student receive one-half credit of both Health and Physical Education. As a result, all freshmen attending Holy Cross High School are scheduled for these courses. Each course is one semester long.

### • Foreign Languages

The "Pre-College Curriculum" calls for students planning on attending college to take at least two years of a foreign language. As a result, most incoming freshmen are encouraged to schedule a Spanish class. We offer Spanish I, Honors Spanish I and Spanish I for Heritage Speakers.

#### History

 All freshmen must take Ancient World Civilizations. Ancient World Civilizations is a one semester class. Students who show a high level of academic achievement and intend on taking Thomas More University World History their sophomore year will be scheduled for Honors Ancient World Civilizations.

#### Elective

- This group consists mainly of one-semester, one-half credit courses. Many of the electives are fine art courses since the State of Kentucky requires one credit in this area to graduate and are coupled with a Computer Applications or Mechanical Drawing course.
- Art I is designed for students who show artistic promise and wish to take additional art classes during high school. This is a full-year course.

# Holy Cross High School Student Network User Agreement

A network of programs, including access to the Internet is available to students and teachers. The proper use of this technology is essential. Students and parents are required to sign a "User Contract" at the beginning of the school year agreeing not to use these services inappropriately.

# **General Computer Network Usage Rules for Students:**

- a) Do not share passwords.
- b) Students may only log into the system using their own account name and password.
- c) No messages are to be sent over the network except via the school provided email system. This also includes notes or letters written to other students.
- d) Do not install software on the network without permission.
- e) Material composed, viewed, sent, or downloaded on the computers or any other electronic media or copiers should be free of language or graphics deemed offensive or obscene by school standards.

Failure to comply with the rules set forth in the agreement for computer network usage will be considered a breach of that agreement. A user who violates this policy and breaches his/her agreement, shall at a minimum, have his/her access to the computer network and Internet terminated, which the school may refuse to reinstate for the remainder of the student's tenure in the school. The school may take additional disciplinary action.
