- **PLAN** test will be given to **sophomores** on **Wednesday, September 24**. Get plenty of rest, eat a healthy breakfast and make sure to bring the appropriate calculators (TI-83 or TI-84 are permitted), as well as No. 2 pencils with easers. The school will <u>not</u> provide extra calculators.
- Juniors will have the opportunity to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 15. The fee for the PSAT is \$15.00. This practice SAT will give students a better idea of what to expect on the SAT. They will get feedback about critical academic skills and be able to prepare for the SAT. It never hurts to practice and prepare for standardized tests!
 PSAT is also used form State and National recognition and honors such as National Merit and Governors Scholar.
